Given how common PDF and Word file formats are, you'd think there's an easy way to convert PDFs into Word documents. Unfortunately, this is not the case. The main advantage of turning a PDF into a Word file is that it makes it easier to edit and format in Microsoft Word. When you do editing in Word, you can easily convert it to a PDF file using the export feature under the File tab. You'll need a few additional tools to convert the PDF into a Word file. Here are three different ways to do it. The easiest and fastest way to convert a PDF to a Word file that you can open on a Mac is to use one of the many free web-based converter tools. For this example, we will use Smallpdf. The Smallpdf PDF to Word converter tool is free to use, but offers more tools and features with its paid premium plans. Go to smallpdf.com/pdf-to-word in a web browser. Open Finder on your Mac, go to the folder where your PDF is stored, select the PDF file and drag it into the blue space on the web page. Also, select select files to open the file download window, select the appropriate PDF file, and then select Open. If your PDF file is stored in your Google Drive account or your Dropbox account, select the arrow icon next to select files, then select from Google Drive or Dropbox to open Google Drive or Dropbox and select the file directly from your account. It may take a few seconds or more for the conversion progress to be completed, depending on the size of the file and the speed of your Internet connection. Once you've completed the conversion, select the arrow down next to the file name to instantly upload it to the DOCX file. You can also choose an envelope icon to create a link online, a Dropbox icon to save it to a Dropbox account, or a Google Drive icon to save it to a Google Drive account. You can hide the PDF in the Word file directly from the PDF document itself, but only if you use the premium Adobe Acrobat Pro DC plan. This plan offers a complete PDF solution for Windows and Mac starting at \$15 per month with a seven-day free trial. We will use the free Adobe Acrobat Pro DC trial in the next steps. Go to acrobat.adobe.com/us/en/acrobat/how-to/pdf-to-word-doc-converter.html in a web browser. Select the Free Start trial and then select Start. On the next page, enter your email address in the box, and then use the dropdown list to choose a plan you would like to subscribe to (monthly, prepaid annual or monthly paid). Choose To Continue when you're done. If you only want to test the service, you can cancel the plan before the seven-day trial and avoid with you On the next page, create or subscribe to your Adobe account by entering your password. Enter the payment information on the next page and then select the Free Start trial. Once your payment information has been accepted, select Start. Acrobat Pro DC will start downloading to your Mac. After how completed, double-click the downloaded file to start installing and follow the instructions. When you see the Acrobat Pro DC installation window, enter your email and password, and then select the login. Use dropdown lists to answer questions. Choose To Continue when you're done. Select Start Installation. Installation may take a few minutes. Once the installation is complete, the Acrobat Pro DC app will automatically open. Select Open File to find and select the PDF file that you would like to convert into the vertical menu to the right of the PDF file, select Export PDF. On the next page, make sure the Microsoft Word option is highlighted in blue. Additionally, select the gear icon to make adjustments to the DOCX settings. Select Export, then use the next window to choose where you want to save the file on your Mac. Optional, rename the file and choose Save. Once the conversion is complete, the file will automatically open to Word. The final way to convert a PDF into a Word document involves using an app called Automator that comes across all Mac computers. This app is used to help you automate certain tasks by creating workflows. Although it won't convert PDFs directly into DOC or DOCX file formats, you can use Automator to save PDF files as Rich Text (TXT) files, which can then be used to open in Word and then save as a Word file. The following instructions apply to Macs running macOS 10.4 or later. Open the app folder. Choose an Automator app marked with a robot image. In the window that asks you to choose the type for the document, select the workflow, and then select Select. In the vertical column, the farthest on the left side of the window, select Files and folders. In the middle, select Ask for Finder items and drag it into the open space to the right. You'll see that there will be a new box. Now go back to the column farther to the left and select the PDF files. In the vertical column in the middle, select extract PDF and drag it back into the open space to the right, under the first box. There's going to be another box. In the Extract PDF text box, choose Rich Text instead of simple text to output. Select the Save file to give your newly created workflow name and select a list of file-format landings to select the app instead of the workflow. Now you can save it anywhere on your Mac. Go to the folder where you've just saved the workflow app and double-click on it. (It should appear as a robot icon.) A file window pops up. Choose a PDF file and then select Select. The PDF file is automatically converted and stored as a Rich Text document in the same folder where the original PDF file was stored. Click the right button on recently Rich Text, hover over Open With and select Word. When you open Word, you can save the file as a standard Word file. Whenever you want to convert a PDF to a Word file, you can use the workflow app created in the steps above. Steps. Keep it on your computer so you don't have to create a new one every time you want to convert a PDF into a Word file. According to Lori Rapoport PDF (Portable Document Format) the file refers to the file format created by Adobe Systems. The PDF file requires the activation of Adobe Acrobat Family software pre-installed on the computer that will download the PDF file. Install adobe Acrobat software reader in your computer. Click on the Download button on Adobe Reader's webpage. Click save the file on the pop-up and wait for the adobe Reader file to load. Choose a folder to download Adobe Acrobat. Click Permission when the pop-up asks for permission to allow the program to make changes on your computer. Click Next on all pop-ups and click Set. Allow the installation of the program. This can take anywhere from thirty seconds to a few minutes. Open your email with the PDF file. Tap the right button on the attachment icon with the attached PDF file attached. Run the cursor down the drop down menu until it touches the Open off, and then, to the right of the Open with, double tap the Adobe Acrobat option. The PDF file will open. Click on the File button on the PDF toolbar and then save a copy. Choose a file folder where you save the PDF file. Click Save. The PDF file will be uploaded to your computer. The ExpressPDF web utility converts your web page, Microsoft Word document or Excel document into a PDF for free. Simply download the document or enter the web page you want to convert, enter your email address and select the quality of the output (your default options, screen optimized, e-book optimized and print optimized). ExpressPDF will send you an email with your new PDF file attached. Okay, so Mac OS X has been able to print out on the PDF for quite some time now and you can install the software to do the same for Windows. ExpressPDF is one of those things that you probably only want to use as a last resort (for example, you need a PDF now on a PC where you can't install the software). ExpressPDF If you have a PDF file that you would like to convert to a PowerPoint presentation, you can download the program to quickly do the job for you, You can use one of the many available online converters. Converting the PDF file into PowerPoint Using Adobe Acrobat DC Adobe Acrobat has several different software options for processing PDF files to choose from - Acrobat Standard DC and Acrobat Pro DC. The standard version is windows only, while the pro version works with both Windows and Mac. They work for for and \$14.99 per month, respectively, so if you're already using one of these, it's probably not worth the money just to convert a PDF file into a PowerPoint. However, Adobe Acrobat is the best program on the market for anything that deals with PDF files, so we recommend subscribing to one if you often do any work with PDF files. Best of all yet, the Acrobat Pro DC has a free trial, so if you're not familiar with Adobe Acrobat, it's worthless to give it a try. In this example, we will use Adobe Acrobat Pro DC. Open the PDF file you want to convert. In the right window glass, select Export PDF. Now you will be faced with a list of different export options. Select Microsoft PowerPoint from the list and select Export. In Windows Explorer (or Finder, if you're using a Mac), select a place to save the file and select Save. Open the newly saved PowerPoint, and you'll see the contents of the PDF file (with each slide representing one page) in the preview panel. Converting the PDF file into PowerPoint Using an online PDF Converter There's certainly no shortage of online PDF-creators-some free, some paid. We recommend Smallpdf because it's fast, free, and keeps the content format pretty consistent. We'll use this online tool for this example, but the process isn't too different between each converter, so feel free to play around and find the one you like the most. With SmallPDF, all you have to do is drag and drop the PDF file on the converter screen, or you can use a file tester. Whichever method you choose, as soon as the file is downloaded, the conversion will automatically begin. Once the conversion is complete, select Download. Once you've completed the download, open the newly saved PowerPoint, and you'll see the contents of the PDF file (with each single-page slide) in the preview panel. Panel.
